(Isaiah 1:17 NET)

Dear Friends,

I felt prompted by the Lord to come up with a **theme verse** for Surge International.

Because my football hero had worn the number 17 it had become "my number" playing youth football and baseball in my hometown.

When I played my first soccer at Azusa Pacific College, yup, you guessed it - I proudly wore number 17 all four years.

Well, early in my search for a verse the Lord brought me to Isaiah 1:17. "Wow" I thought, could this be the verse? But the ending just didn't make sense for a soccer ministry. I searched and searched some more and through the process the Lord always brought me back to Isaiah 1:17.

Still with no resolve regarding the ending of the verse I knew that Isaiah 1:17 was to be our theme verse.

The more I shared the verse the more I liked it and I found others very receptive to the verse as well.

Still something nagged at me from time to time. Had I chosen the verse just because 17 was my favorite number? Had God really led me to this "incomplete" verse for our theme? What sense did that make, an" incomplete" verse?

Once again I arrived in Vienna for the second of my three annu l visits. These trips are always a "whirlwind" with my goal to simply walk in the shoes of our Surge staff. Take them to coffee, take them out for some meals, and go to soccer training with them and their soccer games. Visit our ministry partners. Listen to our staff successes and challenges, try and encourage them if they need encouragement. Generally I am on the go from early morning to late at night for seven solid days.

And then as the Lord so often does he "zinged" me. He made it clear that He had steered me towards Isaiah 1:17 and that the choice of this verse was His.

It was about my third day in Vienna when I was asking one of our staff members about their recent trip to Kosovo, and he said "we served at the <u>Widow's Center</u>." "Zinged", I said "Can you say that again?" <u>Our staff was playing with the children of women who had lost their husbands during the ethnic cleansing</u>; so the <u>widows</u> could go to school and to work to try and support their children.

And God had "completed" our theme verse in His time and his way.
