I managed to huff and puff my way through the charity match and by Monday the Halloween House had been rebuilt.

We don't yet know of the final amount of money raised for the orphanages and an electrical transformer for the RSJB Orphanage. We do know that lives were touched and lives were changed again - because we have continued to travel south of the border each and every year for these past 19 years.

1,300 orphans have been loved by the main orphanage we work with (RSJB). Many of the children come from broken homes. On this trip we met a three week old baby who had a fist print in his forehead from an abusive home situation.
